The California Animal Health & Food Safety Laboratory System (CAHFS), School of Veterinary Medicine, University of California, Davis is offering a two-year residency program in avian diseases. This program is designed to provide training in poultry diagnostics and production medicine for those interested in avian diagnostics and clinical poultry veterinary medicine. The training involves extensive poultry diagnostic casework. Casework is supplemented by weekly case conferences, seminars, lectures, and rotations through specialty laboratories including bacteriology, immunology, histopathology, virology, and toxicology. Two positions are available and are located at the CAHFS Turlock and Tulare laboratories. A DVM is required and one year of internship or equivalent experience is preferred.

The current salary for the first year of the residency program is \$37,308. Continuation in the program is contingent upon mutual satisfaction on the part of both the resident and the CAHFS.

Applicants must request a special application form and prepare to submit (1) a curriculum vitae, (2) a letter of intent, (3) transcripts from veterinary school(s), and (4) three letters of recommendation to: Sharon Hein, Resident Affairs Coordinator, Administration Office, California Animal Health & Food Safety Laboratory, P.O.
